6. STAFF REPORTS

6.A. Executive Director

Executive Director Cahill stated that this past Sunday, a very generous donor arranged for Jonelle McCloud, another staff member, and six kiddos from the Proctor Rec Center, sit front row at the Harlem Globetrotters game as VIPs. It was an amazing experience for all and a big thank you goes to the donor.

6.B. Superintendent of Planning, Design & Construction

President Johnson encouraged Mr. Higgins to contact Executive Director Cahill for more information.

Peoria Zoological Society Board of Director's Meeting Staff Report December 2023

- 1) The meeting was called to order by President David Bielfeldt and minutes from the November 2023 meeting were approved.
- 2) Peoria Park District Update: Emily Cahill reported that Luthy Lights is continuing on Friday and Saturday evenings through December. She also mentioned there are 2 more weekends of Winter Wonderland, held on Saturdays at the Zoo, PlayHouse, and Luthy. In 2024 the Park District will be focusing on strategic plan efforts and several ways to activate the zoo. Emily passed out PPD magnets with a QR code that sends people to a website listing upcoming events.
- 3) <u>Annual Administrative and Operational Agreement</u>: A resolution was adopted in support of the Agreement with the need for further evaluation on some of its provisions.
- 4) Zoo Director's Report: Yvonne Strode reported November attendance at the Zoo was good. We are also seeing a bump in December due to Winter Wonderland attendance. She updated the board on animals that arrived at the Zoo. The first is a male Lady Ross' turaco, which arrived from Phoenix named Arizona. We are waiting for a female to join him next year. The second is a female Thomson Gazelle that came from Busch Gardens in Tampa. She has joined the other animals in our herd on exhibit. The Zoo has received COVID-19 vaccinations for our animals, and the process of inoculating the animals has started. Finally, our muntjac was recently euthanized. Her teeth had deteriorated significantly, leading to a decreased quality of life for the animal.
- 5) <u>Membership Report</u>: Tara Jacobsen reported on membership totals for November. Sales are up compared to last year. The plush promotion is going well; many people will renew their memberships just to receive the stuffed tiger. She informed the board of updates made to the membership brochure and reciprocal list. She passed around examples of both for the board to review.
- 6) Staff Request for Funds: PZS Staff made a proposal to the Board to purchase tables to use at our events. Tables could be purchased for approximately \$9,000 and we are spending over \$3,000 annually to rent tables. In addition to the tables, staff asked for funds to purchase a storage container to hold the tables. The total request for expenditures was \$13,000. PZS board approved the request.
- 7) Event Update: PZS Board set a date for Zoobrew for 2024. It will be held on Thursday, October 3 at the Zoo.
- 8) <u>Update from PPD Regarding Allocated Funds</u>: Brenda O'Russa informed the Board of a presentation Jennifer Swanson made to the finance committee about how money from the \$200,000 grant made to Peoria Zoo was being allocated. The board moved to transfer the full grant balance to the Zoo by the end of 2023.

- 9) Message from President Johnson: Peoria Park Board President Robert Johnson thanked PZS board for their continued work. He recognized the concerns facing the zoo in regards to the Tropics Building and showed PPD's commitment to working toward solutions in 2024.
- 10) <u>Finance Report</u>: Stan Butler reported end of year revenues will be significantly higher than 2022. PZS board reviewed and approved check requests.
- 11) <u>Budget:</u> Stan Butler presented the 2024 budget to the board. He informed the board the operating budget is balanced and break-even. Finance has included \$400,000 for capital campaign expenses for the year, making the overall budget show a deficit of \$382,00 for the year. He pointed out this is not in any way a reflection poor money management it shows our commitment to kicking off a campaign in 2024. The budget was approved by the board of directors.
- 12) Other: Lucinda McArthur requested staff send out an end-of-the-year holiday appeal through Constant Contact. Staff will send the e-mail by December 19.
