President Robert Johnson presided and called the meeting to order at 6:40 pm.

2. ROLL CALL

3. CALL FOR MOTION TO PERMIT TRUSTEE TO ATTEND MEETING ELECTRONICALLY

Trustee Hill requested to attend the meeting electronically due to personal illness. Trustee Bertschy MOVED TO ALLOW Trustee Hill attend the meeting electronically. Motion seconded by Trustee Montez and carried on the following roll call vote: Trustees Bertschy and Montez, Vice President Sierra, and President Johnson. (Results 4 Ayes; 0 Nays)

Trustee Covington requested to attend the meeting electronically due to unexpected childcare obligations. Vice President Sierra MOVED TO ALLOW Trustee Covington attend the meeting electronically. Motion seconded by Trustee Bertschy and carried on the following roll call vote: Trustees Bertschy and Montez, Vice President Sierra, and President Johnson. (Results 4 Ayes; 0 Nays)

5. MINUTES

5.A. Approval of Minutes of April 24, 2024 Regular Board Meeting

Trustee Bertschy requested the language in item 9.A. of the minutes of April 24, 2024 be more clearly written. The wording of the motion to approve the current listing of accounts payable is not clear in its intent. As such, Trustee Bertschy MOVED TO APPROVE the amended April 24, 2024 Regular Board meeting minutes. Motion seconded by Vice President Sierra and carried on the following roll call vote: Trustees Bertschy - Aye, Covington - Aye, Montez - Abstain, Hill – Aye, Vice President Sierra – Aye, and President Johnson - Aye. (Results: 5 Ayes; 1 Abstain; 0 Nays).

6. SPECIAL RECOGNITION

President Johnson stated that On May 15 of each year, the American flag flies at half-staff to show our gratitude and respect for police officers who give their lives in the line of duty. Tonight, I ask that we dedicate our moment of silence to remember those fallen officers.

Those called to service as a police officer do so because of a commitment to keeping us safe and protecting the peace. Their loyalty is seen every day and here at the Peoria Park District, it is seen in our spaces and places where they engage and encourage our patrons to act peacefully. Across America, there are more than 700,000 sworn law officers. When each of them took the oath, these brave men and women accept great responsibility and great risk. On behalf of our Board and staff, and the many citizens that you keep safe every day, I extend our sincere gratitude.

In the Park District in 130 years of service to our community, four officers have lost their lives in the line of duty. Tonight, we pause to thank them and their families. Constable Arthur Smith end of watch June 12, 1922. Officer Charles DeBolt end of watch July 2, 1924. Officer David Gaul end of watch August 4, 1937. Officer Charles Barden end of watch August 24, 1938. President Johnson stated he is honored to be able to express shared gratitude to Chief Green and our Peoria Park District police.

8. COMMITTEE REPORTS

8.A. Finance Committee – Approval of Accounts Payable

The Finance Committee Presents the Accounts Payable for Approval Trustee and Finance Committee Chair Bertschy reported that the Finance Committee met and has examined the bills and found without exception and moves that the President and Secretary be authorized to issue orders to the Treasurer for the several amounts shown in the agenda and MOVED TO APPROVE the current listing of accounts payable. Motion seconded by Trustee Hill and carried on the following roll call vote: Trustees Bertschy, Covington, Hill, Vice President Sierra, and President Johnson. (Results: 6 Ayes; 0 Nays)

8.B. Programming Committee – Minutes of April 4, 2024 Meeting

The approved minutes of the April 4, 2024 Programming Committee meeting were presented for Board review.

8.C. Golf Ad Hoc Committee – Minutes of March 11, 2024 Meeting

The approved minutes of the March 11, 2024 Golf Ad Hoc Committee meeting were presented for Board review.

8.D. Peoria Zoological Society

The April 2024 PZS Board of Directors meeting staff report was presented for Board review.

8.E. Peoria Zoological Society

Executive Director Cahill stated that as s previously shared, Peoria Park District, in consultation with Peoria Zoological Society, issued a Request for Qualification seeking an exhibit design firm to

support renovation of portions of Peoria Zoo. After review of submissions and subsequent interviews, the District and PZS have selected Torre Design to serve in this role and have been in contract negotiations with the firm.

Based on the estimates, PPD staff requested and received authorization from Peoria Zoological Society to move forward with the contracting process. PZS has sufficient funds to cover anticipated costs in 2024 and will begin fundraising in Q4 of 2024. An additional agreement by and between the District and PZS will be executed once the master planning and phase estimating are completed as part of the design process laid out above. The draft contract is currently under legal review and will be provided to the Board for approval as soon as possible. It is anticipated that the contract will be ready for review and approval prior to the June 12 meeting and it is hoped that the contract could be approved via phone poll to keep the project moving forward.

9. NEW BUSINESS

9.A. Consent to Sublease of Franciscan Recreation Center to Goodwill Industries, Inc.

Scott Loftus stated that in the summer of 2022, prior to the master lease agreement with the Regional Office of Education, Goodwill Industries rented space at Franciscan Recreation Center directly from the District. The rental agreement was for eight weeks to host their teen reach program, which served around 25 participants from the area. They are interested in a short-term rental of Franciscan Recreation Complex again this summer. As part of the lease agreement with ROE, they have the ability to sublease to Goodwill Industries pending District approval. After discussions between ROE, Goodwill Industries, and the District, it was determined that space at FRC is available to support Goodwill's summer program again in 2024. As such, ROE seeks to sublease two classrooms, one office, kitchen, and gymnasium to Goodwill Industries from May 28, 2024 through August 2, 2024. These spaces are all part of the original lease between the District and ROE. ROE seeks authorization to sublease the space to Goodwill Industries so that they may host their Youth Summer Leadership Camp, including their Teen REACH program. This program provides training in STEM, life skills, social emotional learning, and more to youth ranging in ages from 11-14. As such, staff recommends the approval of Consent to Sublease of Franciscan Recreation Center to Goodwill Industries, Inc.

Vice President Sierra MOVED TO APPROVE Consent to Sublease of Franciscan Recreation Center to Goodwill Industries, Inc. Motion seconded by Trustee Montez and carried on the following roll call vote: Trustees Bertschy, Covington, Montez, Vice President Sierra and President Johnson. (Results: 5 Ayes; 0 Nays).

9.B. Ordinance #402 – Disposal of Personal Property

Karrie Ross stated that staff recommends adoption of Ordinance #402 to authorize the disposition of personal property that is no longer necessary or useful to the Peoria Park District.

Trustee Bertschy MOVED TO APPROVE Ordinance #402 – Disposal of Personal Property. Motion seconded by Vice President Sierra and carried on the following roll call vote: Trustees Bertschy, Covington, Montez, Vice President Sierra and President Johnson. (Results: 5 Ayes; 0 Nays).

9.C. Peoria Zoo Spider Monkey Outdoor Enclosure Bid

Becky Fredrickson stated that this recommendation is for the purchase and installation of an outdoor enclosure for the Spider monkeys. This is a requirement by AZA to provide access to the outside for the Spider monkeys located in the Tropics Building. In-house staff will install the base

for the caged exhibit. The contractor will provide and install the transfer chute and mesh cage system. This contractor has successfully completed several smaller projects for the Peoria Zoo in the past and is very familiar with this project. They also complete larger projects for other zoos throughout the country. This contractor however, requests that the Performance and Labor & Material Bonds requirement be waived on this project. Park District policy is to require these bonds on all construction projects over \$30,000. The State of Illinois under the Public Construction Bond Act, 30 ILCS 550/1 et seq. and Public Act 103-570 requires public works projects over \$150,000 to have Performance and Payment Bonds. Due to limited bids and difference in pricing for the two bids, staff feels it is in the Park District's best interest to waive this requirement on this project.

Trustee Bertschy MOVED TO APPROVE the Peoria Zoo Spider Monkey Outdoor Enclosure Bid. Motion seconded by Trustee Montez and carried on the following roll call vote: Trustees Bertschy, Covington, Montez, Vice President Sierra and President Johnson. (Results: 5 Ayes; 0 Nays).
